THE RUGBY TOWN TOURISM PARTNERSHIP

Following a consultation process in 2017 to understand how businesses, attractions and accommodation providers can work together more effectively to promote Rugby visitor's economy, stakeholders were invited to a Tourism Partnership meeting in March. At the meeting Andrew Meredith Associates presented the findings from a tourism study completed last year. The group discussed a potential collaborative framework for delivering under the objectives of Rugby's Destination Management Plan.

A key outcome of the meeting was to set-up some sub-groups to take responsibility for collectively delivering some tourism-related projects. Tentatively, these will be based around the themes (subject to interest levels).

- **Events** growing the town centre events programme and establishing stronger links with the wider borough.
- **Food and drink** enhancing promotion of the existing offer and developing new products for this rapidly growing tourism sector.
- **Heritage and culture** helping local people re-discover the local offer and attracting new visitors to the town.




THE BIKES ARE BACK IN TOWN

TO THE POINT

Within a period of three months the Rugby First team have filled a 22 litre Sharps bin with needles. The majority of the needles are collected from behind businesses, the streets and in doorways. Much of the work is carried out first thing in the morning before customers and staff arrive in town to shop or work. If you spot a needle please do not pick up and contact Rugby First who will remove it safely.

As well as providing a visible presence on the streets the Rangers also deal with stray animals in the town centre. In the past this has even included a racing pigeon but the most recent animal rescue was a stray Staffordshire bull terrier that was successfully reunited with its owner.

DON'T HANG AROUND... FOR YOUR HANGING BASKET!



Just a reminder that if you have not returned your booking form for your hanging basket please do so as quickly as possible so you don't miss out on the discounted price (if you have lost your form we can send electronically). The floral displays create a great first impression as well as add a splash of colour to your business front! Baskets are supplied by the Council at a cost of £50 but Rugby First subsidises these by £20 meaning you pay just thirty pounds. This year as an additional incentive Rugby First will pay for the hanging bracket if you do not have one already – a further saving of £19! TOWN CCTV FOOTAGE SECURES RAPISTS CONVICTION

CCTV footage provided by Rugby First control room formed part of the evidence used to convict a rapist following an incident in 2016 where a vulnerable young woman was raped in the town centre. A ranger who dealt with the incident initially (when the woman contacted a local business immediately following the incident) also provided key evidence as part of the case.



WORLD AUTISM AWARENESS WEEK

It was World Autism Awareness week in March and it is well worth highlighting the work the Rangers do to support people that have autism and visit the town centre. Autistic people sometimes find different situations difficult and may struggle particularly in busy spaces. The Rangers are always on hand to help and on many occasions it is the trusted and recognised face of a Ranger and the relationship that they have built with a wide range of people that can make the difference.





OVER 60S RECEIVE SAS TRAINING WITH SANTANDER

On Thursday 22 March the Rugby branch of Santander held a Scam Avoidance School (SAS) to help address the number of scams targeted at the over 60s. The new scheme was especially designed for this age group and was rolled out across every one of its 806 branches.

The lesson, which includes interactive activities and a handout to take away, covers the tricks scammers use to reel people in, how to spot email and text scams as well as covering contactless fraud and cashpoint fraud - areas that the research highlighted as being a real concern to the over 60s. The course also covered the methods criminals use at cash point machines. Part of the Rugby First Rangers duty is to check cash point machines along with suspicious activity and on many occasions they along with CCTV operators have been able to stop scammers and fraudsters in the process.
